

Locality will:

- Liaise with production and owner at all times to organise site visits, answer questions, discuss fees etc.
- Ask production to complete an Intentions Form detailing all requirements.
- Negotiate all location hire fees.
- Discuss those intentions with the property owner.
- Draw up a Location Hire Agreement for both parties to sign.
- Supply invoices and collect payment on behalf of the owner.
- Sort out any after-shoot problems.

The Owner:

- Should supply personnel to oversee the film crew on site, this includes site visits and during the period of access. Locality can provide this if you are unable to.
- Should be available to check the location after the shoot and complete the Sign Off Sheet.

The Production must always:

- Produce a Health and Safety Risk Assessment to cover the action on site.
- Pay the location hire fee before the first day of access.
- Pay a Damage Deposit ranging from £500 to £10,000 based on the amount of areas accessed/type of property/length of time on site.

When filming on site Production is expected to:

- Never remove, cover or block emergency signage.
- Remove all waste it creates at the end of each day and within the times of hire period. (Additional charges may occur if premises are not left in satisfactory condition).
- Supply security personnel to man the doors to the premises at all times.
- The Production is solely responsible for all items of equipment and vehicles, the owner does not accept responsibility for any lost or stolen items.
- To have at least one "appointed first aid person" on site at all times.
- Not to move or touch the owners possessions unless noted in the contract particulars.
- Not to move or operate the owners machinery.
- Avoid identifying the owner, personnel, visitors or tenants, on screen in any manner unless specific permission has been obtained.
- Not to cover smoke detectors without consent and then to ensure they are uncovered after the shot.
- Supply personnel to check the location with the owner after the shoot and complete the Sign Off Sheet.

Terms:

- Cancellation fees are 100% if cancelled after both parties have signed the Location hire Agreement.
- Film days are 12 hours - Photoshoot days are 10 hours - Unit base is up to 24 hours

<p>The Stiperstones NNR is a spectacular 10-kilometre ridge in south-west Shropshire rising to 536 metres above sea level. The wild, dramatic scenery inspires myth, folklore and literary connections; and a history of mining and farming.</p> <p>The reserve is owned and managed by a partnership of organisations. The organisations and the landholdings they manage include:</p> <p>Natural England: The Stiperstones Forestry England: Eastridge Wood Shropshire Wildlife Trust: Earl's and Pontesford Hill, The Hollies, Brook Vessons, Johns Wood, Tankerville, Lower Bog, Nipstone Rock and Jubilee Wood and Hope Valley Linley Estate: extensive areas of the Estate including Black Radley Hill and Heath Mynd (no website) Middle Marches Community Land Trust: Norbury Hill and Minsterley Meadows Shropshire County Council: The Bog, Snailbeach Mine and Poles Coppice</p> <p>Recreational events such as orienteering, mountain biking and rock climbing are by permit only.</p>

Unusual features	This is a wild and atmospheric landscape, with a geology of national significance. The Ordovician 'Stiperstones Quartzite', which makes up the ridge was shattered during the last ice age to create the jagged, boulder-strewn landscape seen today.

Specific to the location	The Stiperstones is notified and legally protected as a Site of Special Scientific Interest. Of the 588 hectares of SSSI, 481 comprise a National Nature Reserve (NNR)
Site visit requirements(charged for, escorted, etc)	The open hill ground is 'access land' over which you have a right to walk, but in the interest of wildlife and livestock, please keep to the network of well-defined footpaths. - Watch your step, as many of the paths are rocky and steep.
H&S or PPE requirements	The Stiperstones is an upland area where weather conditions can deteriorate rapidly and become severe at any time of year, particularly in winter. The area is also subject to lightning strikes.
Shared site/tenants	open access land open to public 24/7

Disabled access	The 650 metre (700 yard) All-ability Trail starts from The Stiperstones NNR car park, near the reserved parking spaces. The Trail has an all-weather surface, but please be aware that it is open to horse and bicycle riders and occasional works traffic. Tapping rail is there for visitors with impaired vision.

Other points, restrictions or policies associated with this location	Keep an eye open for signs warning of mine workings and heather burning. Sporting rights are privately owned; these include the rights to shoot game and to shoot, trap and snare those predators of game which are not legally protected, so keep your dog on a lead and watch your step. Shoots may take place at any time from 12 August to 1 February inclusive. Make sure you have suitable clothes and footwear (walking boots). Carry spare clothes and refreshment. Take a mobile phone or let someone know your route and estimated arrival time
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
